Workshop theme

Modern organizations, at any scale, from the macro level, including industries, markets, and countries, to the micro level, involving firms and individuals, are complex systems characterized by heterogeneous and interdependent agents, who self-organize and co-evolve with the environment. Recent critical events and resulting crises have clearly emphasized that their structures and processes are fluid and continuously transforming, thereby calling for dynamic and adaptive approaches able to handle their complexity.

This workshop will focus on recent advances in theory and models regarding how organizations (firms, networks, industries) deal with the current competitive challenges by using a complexity theory approach. Ranging from single firms to networks of industries, the workshop will explore their innovation dynamics and sustainable structures and processes by using the agent-based simulation and will provide managerial insights useful to surf their increasing complexity.
